

SLEEPING COMFORTABLY

A tent (with stakes, guy lines and a hammer) Sleeping bags (with optional liners) Sleeping pads / Air mattresses (inc. repair kit) Pillows (Bring your own pillow and use in the car for little snoozes on the road!)

Flashlight or Lanterns (save your phone battery!) Multi-tool or knife Extra blanket (useful in the car)
